TELL ME WHAT YOU'RE LOOKING FOR (TACTILE TRAINING)

In this version of the game, put all the wooden pieces in a bag and place all the picture cards next to the bag to see which pictures are in the game. The youngest player starts the game **by saying what they are going to hunt for**. For example, a toy car. They then try to fish the car out of the bag by touch. If they succeed, they keep the car visible in front of them. If they don't, they put the winning piece back in the bag. Then it's the next player's turn to say what they're going to hunt.

The winner is the one who has the most wooden pieces in front of them when there is no picture left in the bag (except for the octopus Kvido).

If you draw **Kvido the octopus**, you must **put one of your pieces back** in the bag together with Kvido. This is because Kvido has nothing to play with and would like one of the pieces for more fun.

However, if you are playing with young children, you can play with Kvido as you would with a normal wooden piece. That is, the person who announces in advance that they are going to fish it out gets to keep it if they actually finds it by touch.

LOTTO (TACTILE TRAINING)

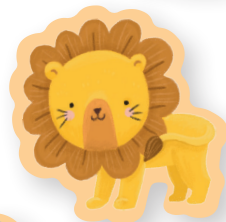
Give **each player one card** and determine **whether to collect pictures in the same colors or by thematic groups**. If you are playing with just two people, each person can have 2 cards, but always collect only by colour or by theme, you cannot combine.

Put the wooden pieces you have on the cards in the bag. If you want a harder version of the game, you can put all of them in there, including the octopus Kvido.

Gradually **draw** the wooden pictures you have on the cards from the bag without looking in the bag. Then try to **feel them and guess what shape they are**. If you draw a piece that is yours, put it on the card. Then the next player plays. If you draw a piece that is not on your card, put it back in the bag.

If you draw **Kvido the octopus**, you are in luck, because you can draw twice from the bag. Then return Kvido again.

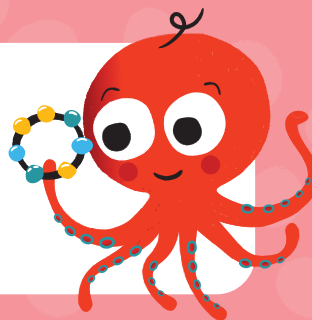
The first player to fill their card with all four pictures wins.



Dear children and dear adults,

I'm very glad you want to play my wooden lotto game.

I have three game variants for you to choose from:



MATCHING - FOR THE YOUNGEST CHILDREN (TRAINING EYESIGHT AND LOGIC)

Lay out all the wooden pieces picture side up and place the playing cards next to them. The child chooses one of the playing cards and the side to collect. Then go through the pictures on the card together and say what the child will collect (e.g.: toys, fruit, yellow objects, or green objects). The child is then **asked to select** the wooden pieces **that are on the card** and **to name them** at the same time. If they find it difficult, you can help them. When they fill the whole card, they can draw another card and look for other objects again.

If you chose the side of the card with the colour first, continue with other colours. If, on the other hand, you do thematic sorting, continue with different themes (animals, fruits, toys, shapes, clothes). In this game, everyone who manages to find all 4 wooden pieces with pictures on their card wins.
